

Data protection notice for visitors

Dear visitor!

We treat your data strictly confidential. We are obliged to protect your personal data processed in the course of your visit at our factory premises and we take this duty seriously. We always comply with the applicable legal provisions on the protection, lawful handling and confidentiality of personal data and on data security, in particular the European General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR") and the applicable national data protection regulations. Please take the time to read this information sheet and get an idea of why we collect your data as part of the visitor registration process and how we will process it.

1 Who is responsible for data processing?

The controller for visitor management and the associated access control to our factory premises is the

voestalpine BÖHLER Profil GmbH (hereinafter "we", "us")

2 For what purpose is your data processed and how do we justify the processing?

Your data will be processed for the following purposes:

- » Access control to ensure that only authorised persons have access to the factory premises
- » Proof that you have been informed/trained about the rules of behaviour on the factory premises
- » Protection of the company's property and infrastructure against damage, burglary, theft and other damaging behaviour

The processing of your data is therefore based on our legitimate interests in the fulfilment of our security requirements and to safeguard our legal claims (Art 6 (1) (f) GDPR).

You are neither legally nor contractually obliged to provide us with your personal data as part of the visitor registration process. However, failure to provide your data would mean that you could not be granted access to our factory premises.

3 To whom is your data transmitted?

The processing of your personal data takes place within our company and at our processor Vizito BV, Genkersteenweg 49, 3500 Hasselt, Belgium, which provides us with the software for visitor registration and administers it.

In order to achieve the intended purposes, it may be necessary for us to disclose your data to courts, administrative authorities and legal representatives in order to assert, exercise or defend legal claims.

4 How long will your data be stored?

Your data will be stored for 1 year in order to fulfil the purpose of property protection and to be able to prove that you have been trained in the rules of conduct on the factory premises.

5 What rights do you have?

We would like to inform you that you always have the right to request information about which of your data we process (see in detail Art 15 GDPR), the right to have your data corrected or deleted (see in detail Art 16 GDPR), the right to restrict the processing of your data (see in detail Art 18 GDPR), the right to object to data processing (see in detail Art 21 GDPR), the right to data portability (see in detail Art 20 GDPR).

If you believe that your personal data is processed unlawfully, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the Austrian data protection authority or with another data protection supervisory authority, especially at your place of residence or work.
